

St Teresa's is an average sized primary school situated in Heaton, Newcastle, catering for pupils aged 4-11. Pupil premium funding is below national average (21.6%) and those who do not have English as their first language is high (20.2k%)

At St Teresa's we are committed to ensuring that all pupils, including those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), receive their right to a high quality and accessible curriculum. Children's all-round development is paramount to us and we endeavour to provide distribution a wide range of experiences and opportunities so that they experience success and are well equipped for the future.

Our aim is to provide all children with the best possible outcomes in preparation for life- longlearning. We believe it is important that children acquire skills, knowledge and confidence that can be applied to all future learning experiences, including social, physical and spiritual development. We endeavour to raise aspirations and expectations for all pupils, including those pupils with SEND by working in partnership with parents/carer and listening to pupils.

Children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities at St Teresa's School are supported breach the highest standard they possibly can. This is made possible through careful and thoughtful provision for children with Special Educational Needs. Regular monitoring and pupil progress meetings support the assessment and next steps for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. All SEN pupils have targets set on their individual SEN Support Plans. These are reviewed termly in a formal meeting with the school SENCO or at aparent's evening. The outcome of bespoke and recommended interventions are recorded on the SEND Support plans.



PUPIL VIEWS

Pupils are consulted throughout the target setting process and are aware of their individual targets.

Pupils are encouraged to have a voice in school and they know who the adults are that they canpass on worries or concerns to. Classrooms have 'A Time to Chat' boxes for children to privately ask for help when needed. There is an ethos where children feel comfortable and are encouraged to talk to their peers and staff.

NEXT STEPS

To attend pupil participation events within Newcastle e.g. music and sport

To encourage the attendance of pupils at their review meetings, in particular Annual reviews so that can be involved in discussions.

To continue to encourage SEND pupils to take-up after school clubs.

PARENT/CARER VIEWS

St Teresa's has positive attitudes to parents/carers and values their important role in their child's education. Parents/carers are always informed when their child is placed on the SEN register and the graduated response, outlined in the Code of Practice, is explained to them. Parents are informed about the Newcastle Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information Advice and Support Service. This service provides, advice and support at any stageof a child or young person's education, and provides an Independent Supporter for families in the process of getting an Education Health and Care Plan. Parents are fully informed in the review process. Written information is in accessible formats and sufficient notice is given for meetings to enable parents/carers time to prepare. We collect the views of parents/carers in a variety of ways.
