There are lots of important times/updates in this edition, as we prepare in the lead-up to Christmas.

This **Saturday 7 December, from 4pm-6pm**, we will be holding our annual **Christmas Bazaar** in school. This is a vital way for the Friends of St. Teresa's to raise funds for our children. We hope that as many of you can support our efforts that day by coming along.

Next week, we welcome our parents/family members from Reception to Year 2, to watch our **Christmas Nativity**. These will be taking place on Tuesday 10 and Wednesday 11 December, at 9.30am.

Children are encouraged to bring a small donation (suggestion £1) that we can then donate to local charity Vinnies, in Byker, which will help towards their Christmas meal appeal. Christmas dinner day is on this day. After school, we have our Christmas film nights until 5.15pm.

Monday 16 December, we will be holding our annual **Christmas Carol Service.** This is a chance for as many of our Key Stage 2 children, from Year 3 to Year 6 to join us at 4pm in church to lead our celebrations.

On **Wednesday 18 December**, all children will be attending the **Christmas Pantomime at the Tyne Theatre.** On the night time, at 6pm, there is the partnership of churches/schools **Carol Service** -all are welcome to join us.

Christmas party day will be on **Thursday 19 December.** Children can wear their party clothes for the day and can bring in a paper plate with their food on for the party (please put your child's name on this).

The last day, **Friday 20 December**, will see us celebrate Mass together in church -all are welcome to join us. In the afternoon, at 2.30pm, there will be our annual **'Carols in the Forest School'**-all welcome to join us for this event.



Attendance



As a school, we have an attendance target of 96%. Our whole school attendance has been consistently above this since the start of the year -thank you to all parents/carers in your part in ensuring your child/ren's good attendance and punctuality.

Week 1 September attendance = 97.5%

Week 2 September attendance = 98.4%

Week 3 September attendance = 94.9%

Week 4 September attendance = 96.8%

Week 5 October attendance = 96.9%

Week 6 October attendance = 96.8%

Week 7 October attendance = 96.1%

Week 8 October attendance = 94.2%

Week 9 November attendance = 94.9%

Week 10 November attendance = 96.1%

Week 11 November attendance = 96.3%

Sickness bugs can be common-place at this time of year. If your child suffers from sickness or diarrhoea, please ensure they are off school for 48 hours after the last symptoms.

Please do try to keep holidays to the school holidays. Any request for holidays will be unauthorised and your child will miss out on vital education time. The school will not supply work for your child if you choose to take them out of school in term time.

Did you know?

90% attendance sounds good but means that your child misses on average:

- One half day every week.
- Nearly four weeks every school year.
- Over one school year in a school career.

2 weeks holiday in term time every year with no other absences means that your child:

- Can only ever achieve 95% attendance
- Will miss about two terms in a school career

Being just 5 minutes late every day adds up to missing about 3 days of school every year.
